1950	Asociacion Nacional Mexico-Americana established.
1952	Dwight D. Eisenhower elected president.
1953	Korean War truce signed. CIA supported coup in Iran. Earl Warren appointed U.S. chief justice. House Concurrent Resolution 108.
1954	Army - McCarthy hearings CIA intervention in Guatemala.
1955	Salk polio vaccine developed. First postwar U.S Soviet summit meeting. James Dean stars in "REBEL WITHOUT A CAUSE".
1956	Interstate Highway act. Suez crisis. Eisenhower reelected.
1957	Eisenhower Doctrine announced. Civil Rights Act (first since Reconstruction). Little Rock school-desegregation crisis. Soviet Union launches "SPUTNIK". Peak of "baby boom" (4.3 million births).

1965	Bombing of North Vietnam and Americanization of the war begin.
1966	Black Panthers formed. Abolition of automatic student deferment from the draft.
1967	Massive antiwar demonstrations. Race riots in Newark, Detroit, and other cities. March on the Pentagon.
1968	Tet offensive. President Lyndon B. Johnson announces that he will not seek reelection. Martin Luther King, Jr., assassinated; race riots sweep nation. Robert F. Kennedy assassinated. Vietnam peace talks open in paris. Richard Nixon elected president.
