- * **gunner** - operator of a gun

- * **bombadier** - person specialized in dropping bombs
- * **barracks** - military residence
- * **soup** - term used by troops to refer to the cold wet climate they experienced in England, fog
- * **skeet** - round balls of clay about 3 1/2 inches around, used in shooting sports, Troops referred to them as pigeons. They were used to help the troops train for aerial attack.
- * **B-38, B-47, B-51**, - fighter planes used in W.W.II
- * **B-17, B-24, B-25, B-26**, - bomber planes used in W.W.II
- * **flak**- fragments of bullets
- * **flak suit** - suit worn in W.W.II to protect the pilots from flak
- * **kwanzaa huts** - a European term for the thatched straw huts built to house the fleeing population of England during W.W.II
