President Lyndon B. Johnson announces that he will not seek reelection.
Martin Luther King, Jr., assassinated; race riots sweep nation.
Robert F. Kennedy assassinated.
Vietnam peace talks open in paris.
Richard Nixon elected president.

1969 Apollo 11 lands first Americans on the moon.
