Introduction

The <u>Jacksonville Republican</u> was one of the oldest newspapers in Northeast Alabama and remains today as a valuable record of the life and times of the people who lived in this area. Although not a complete collection, the original scattered newspapers remaining from 1837 to 1904 are in the Alabama State Department of Archives and History in Montgomery. They have been microfilmed on two different occasions: in 1970 for Jacksonville State University, and in 1977 for the Public Library of Anniston and Calhoun County. The newspaper moved from Jacksonville to Anniston in December 1895 and did not resume publication in Jacksonville until 1900. The Anniston years were not included in these collections.

This index, made possible by a grant from the Center for Southern Studies at Jacksonville State University, covers both sets of microfilm, although in many instances, the Anniston film itself is virtually unreadable. The user should locate the year, then check the inventory list for particular dates. A little diligence might be required to find some issues, as there are both gaps and omissions in the film as well as numerous duplications. In addition, two of the JSU reels were missing at the time of this project.*

The index includes names, local events, state and national happenings, and local advertisements. No attempt was made to record long lists of names, such as persons who attended events, or numerous officers of organizations, or voters' lists, or references to persons who were in or out of town for the day. Instead, names were noted in specific contexts, particularly obituaries, executor's and administrator's notices.

estate sales, marriages, political candidates, and social or business events. Local advertisements, which for the most part ran for months or even years, were noted when they first appeared.

Brief History

The <u>Jacksonville Republican</u> first appeared in January 1837. J. F. Grant, the publisher, was born in North Carolina in 1809 and moved to Jacksonville in 1834. His first venture was to publish, along with Reverend William Wood, a Baptist newspaper. Apparently, no issues remain of this early publication. By 1837, Wood sold out to Grant, who noted in the first issues of the <u>Republican</u> that it was "impossible to continue" the Jacksonville <u>Register</u>, but he was "determined to continue the business in this place" by publishing a political and miscellaneous newspaper. Naming the new publication for the type of free popular government in the United States, Grant remained throughout his career staunchly Democratic and anti-Whig, anti-Republican Party, and anti-Radical.

The weekly newspaper, which sold for \$2.50 per year, appeared variously on Saturdays, Thursdays, Wednesdays, and Tuesdays, and changed in size from five columns in the 1830s to seven columns in the 1850s, six columns in the 1860s, eight columns briefly in the 1870s and back to seven columns. During the Civil War years the four-page paper was reduced to two pages, or a "half-sheet."

In the absence of a wire service in the earlier years, the newspaper kept up with state and regional news through an exchange system with other publishers. The outside sheets or pages one and four came pre-printed and the inside, or pages two and three, contained the locally printed matter. Grant filled these inside pages primarily with political news, such as the

Congressional record and state legislative proceedings, with very little local news included. Moreover, the early newspaper had no headlines and very little organization. To complicate matters, volume and issue numbers and the dates were not always accurate.

For most of the <u>Republican</u>'s life, the motto which appeared under the banner was, "The price of liberty is eternal vigilance." Briefly in 1842, the motto was replaced with "All that we deem ancient, at one time was new, and what we now defend by example, on a future day will stand as precedent."

Grant always seemed sensitive to the needs of the readers. He generously published lengthy letters to the editor, which are good commentaries on the times. Rarely did the writers sign their own names, posing instead as "Cherokee" or "Back Woodsman" or "A Voter," for example. The publisher responded to complaints about the number of patent medicine advertisements by dropping them completely for a time in 1851. He also turned to others for assistance at times. The name C. Lewis appeared as co-publisher in 1848 and John H. Caldwell in 1852, both only briefly.

The man to whom Grant turned as a successor, however, was his son, L. W. "Lon" Grant. The older Grant was elected State Treasurer in 1870 and began relinquishing editorial control of the paper. By then, subtle changes were underway. After years of the difficulties of publishing through a war and then under martial law in Reconstruction, prosperity was returning, not only to the paper but the town. New railroad and telegraph connections by 1868 broadened the town's ties to the larger world. By the 1870s, local news coverage, which had begun increasing by the time of the war, now included columns from such outlying areas as Cross Plains, Oxford, Rabbit Town, Ladiga, Corn Grove, Frog Level, Davisville, Piney

Woods, and Choccolocco. These local reports had faded away by 1872, later replaced by recipes and columns of advice on domestic and agricultural matters.

On the occasion of the beginning of the newspaper's forty-first year in 1877, the editor noted proudly that the <u>Jacksonville Republican</u> had never suspended publication, "except for 5 or 6 weeks at the end of the war when there were no postal facilities of any kind."

"Father Grant of the Alabama Press," as he was fondly known by then, died on October 10, 1878, the oldest newspaperman in the state at that time. The printer reversed the column rules in the traditional "habiliments of mourning," to show a thick black line between the columns rather than the customary thin rules. This had been done on other occasions: in the issue of July 27, 1850, for the death of President Zachary Taylor; on January 2, 1862, to honor the war dead; on April 20, 1864, for the death of Lt. John Francis. Later, the column rules were turned again in the issue of October 15, 1870, for the death of Robert E. Lee; on September 30, 1871, for General James H. Clanton's death; on January 12, 1884, for Mrs. J. F. Grant; and on September 21, 1901, for President William McKinley.

Lon Grant was an energetic apologist for the Democratic Party and Southern interests as well as an enthusiastic political participant. While editor, he served on the town council, in the Alabama House of Representatives, and then in the State Senate. Later he was a Congressional candidate. His law card and real estate and insurance advertisements attest to the fact that Grant was indeed an involved man.

By the 1880s, the newspaper mirrored both Grant's interests and desire to increase circulation. More local advertisements and homey

personal items had replaced national news. The editor dropped the patent, or pre-printed outside pages beginning with the issue of October 20, 1883, perhaps reflecting the growing competition of newer papers in the county, including the Anniston Hot Blast.

Lon Grant's editorial duals with the <u>Hot Blast</u> in the presidential election of 1884 and again in the Probate Judge's race of 1886 reveal the deep-seated rivalry between Jacksonville and Anniston. Ironically, at the same time Anniston merchants were increasingly patronizing the <u>Republican</u>'s advertisement columns. Most of the ads were from Anniston by 1893.

Dr. T. W. Ayers bought the <u>Republican</u> from Lon Grant in August 1894. Ayers began filling the front page with locals from such places as White Plains, Mink, Egypt, Bera, Jenkins, Bruner, Grayton, Merrellton, and of course, news and ads from Anniston. Ayers relentlessly stood in favor of free and unlimited coinage of silver. Throughout 1895, almost every issue contained articles on the subject. Not everyone in Jacksonville agreed with him. He announced on December 7, 1895, that for "business reasons" he was moving the newspaper to Anniston. He explained that a gold-supporting paper would soon begin publication, and that Jacksonville could not support two newspapers.

By 1900 the <u>Republican</u> resumed publication in Jacksonville under the direction of B.C. Harper, manager-editor, and W. M. Hames, Jr., local editor. Henry Graham edited the paper in 1901, followed by E. W. Mellichampe in 1902.

The newspaper never did regain that personal journalistic touch of the Grants. During 1902 almost no local news appeared, and by 1903, when the masthead listed J. H. Mellichampe as publisher, the editorial material had disappeared. The paper consisted mostly of "canned" material. Moreover, large spaces taken up with such messages as "Subscribe to the Republican" indicated a scarcity of advertisers as well. Walter J. Clark bought the newspaper in May 1904, and shortly thereafter, the collection ended.

Despite its ups and downs, the <u>Republican</u> was a remarkable newspaper for a town the size of Jacksonville. That it succeeded in the nineteenth century was largely due to the dedication and the tenacity of the Grant family. They never printed enough local news to satisfy the curiosity of the modern reader, perhaps because everyone in town already knew what had happened. Nevertheless, the <u>Jacksonville Republican</u> is a window through which we can glimpse briefly into the past.
